Philadelphia Piers Scenic and Full of Education Opportunities

Were you among one of the 35,000 people who visited Spruce Street Harbor Park each week? If you thought you missed your opportunity to enjoy the tasty food, colorful sights, and life-sized games have no fear because The Delaware River Waterfront Corporation (DRWC) has extended its stay until September 28th. Once it closes, it will not reopen until next year. This popular site may be just the place to have lunch or relax after your next trip to the Independent Seaport Museum.

More recently, The DRWC opened a permanent waterfront park located at The Washington Avenue Pier. Formerly known as Pier 53, the place provides numerous connections to science, social studies, mathematics, and English! Whether it's the wetlands that are nearby or its connections to shipbuilding or immigration in the 1870's, parents and teachers can find many connections for students to the area just south of our school campuses.
