one-tenth of the Top 50 colleges whose students earn the highest salaries were maritime academies. This might come to a surprise to some, but in an industry that relates to so many essential facets of our economy, it is no wonder that the hard work of these graduates is rewarded with well-paying jobs. Among the five schools that were ranked, the average median earnings is over \$80,000.

Many of our board members and faculty are graduates of these esteemed institutions, and it's a benefit for our MACHS cadets to not only have such people as a reference, but to also be guided under their tutelage. The five maritime institutions and their median salaries were:

#2. United States Merchant Marine Academy (\$89,000), #7. California Maritime Academy (\$81,100), #9. Massachusetts Maritime Academy (\$79,500), #14. SUNY Maritime College (\$77,300), and #21. Maine Maritime Academy (\$74,700). Many thanks to Board Member John Brennan who informed us of this news.

Highlighting some of the more important upcoming examinations

Benchmarks, Keystone Exams, and ASVAB Tests, Oh My!

With Chromebook carts fully deployed, the middle school has been earnestly completing StudyIsland assignments as part of their standardized test preparation. For the next two weeks, faculty and cadets will truly understand how far along they've come with their work when Benchmark tests are administered. Meanwhile, cadets in the high school have been preparing for the Keystone examinations, with the Algebra I Keystones taking place this week. The English Keystone exams were already completed last week. For those who do not know, Pennsylvania state legislators passed a bill at the end of November that would delay the use of the Keystone examinations as a graduation requirement until the 2018-2019 school year. The reason for this was because the initial decision did not allow for input from legislation, and given various discussions related to the Common Core curricula and high-stakes testing, such a reevaluation might be necessary. Maritime Academy Charter School cadets will continue to require the completion of the Algebra I and English Literature project for any graduating cadet who has yet to score Proficient or better in order to maintain our academic rigor.

Since MACHS is not only about preparing our cadets for college, but also for potential careers, **Chief Hentnick (HS)** will administer the **Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB).** Given at least twice a year, cadets determine which area of the Armed Forces best aligns to their various skills. This is simply the initial step, and is in no way an indication that our cadets should enter into a field of the military. Nevertheless, numerous graduates over the years have enlisted or attended schools with a **Reserve Officers' Training Corps (ROTC)** program.

Finally, as if the day-to-day success of our cadets is not enough, the **2014-2015 School Progress Report** has been released by the Philadelphia School District, and Maritime Academy Charter School has improved since last year. In a year when most Philadelphia schools showed struggles, both our middle school and high school excelled. In fact, our high school was classified as a Peer Leader in the field of "Progress," which measures a school's growth on standardized tests and graduation planning.
