Our goal is to give our cadets an appreciation of our nation's maritime heritage and encourage them to love things maritime and become active members of the maritime workforce.

We are proud of our many success stories which include two of our female cadets who are current students at SUNY Maritime College and a recent graduate who is attending Maine Maritime College. Many of our cadets serve on active duty in the US Coast Guard and US Navy. It should be noted that women have been well received in maritime education and career opportunities. They are Captains and Chief Engineers of US Merchant Ships and Executives in many maritime related businesses.

This year, our school theme is "Year of Mathematics and Be Rich in Kindness". We will be providing additional supports and interventions, if necessary, to our students who may need extra help in some areas.
